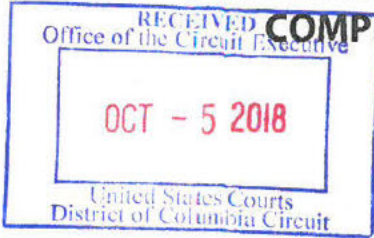

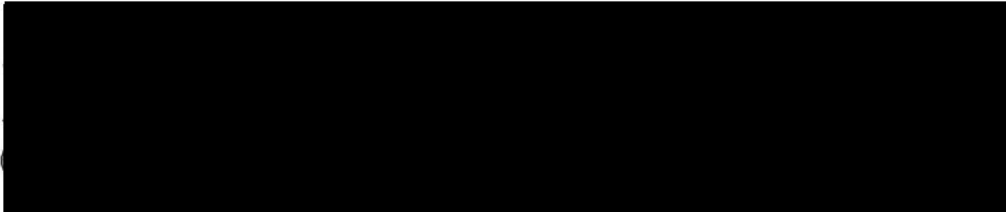

To Whom it May Concern:

Judge Kavanaugh has been interviewed for a seat on the Supreme Court. During these hearings, I, as a citizen and lay person became appalled at the way he behaved before the Senate Committee, especially during the afternoon after Dr. Ford's morning interview on 9-27-2018. I must confess I was shocked at his demeanor which can be best described as immature and impulsive, without restraint (regressed as if he is still in his adolescence,) belligerent, and disrespectful. He appears to be highly prejudiced in his views, suggesting that others are responsible for his misfortune, accusing Democrats of partisan conspiracies against him, even referencing conspiracies he thinks are linked to the Clintons. His disrespectful responses to Democratic Senators were particularly alarming.

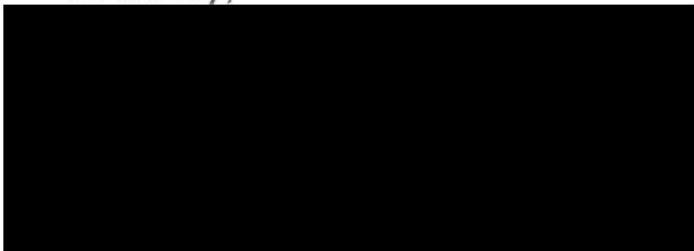
I am registering a complaint against Judge Kavanaugh, who I believe failed to perform to the standard of conduct expected of those who "wear the robes of justice." I highly doubt that Judge Kavanaugh is able to maintain a neutral and non-prejudicial, non-partisan stance while ruling on cases that may come before him as a Supreme Court Justice. It is not a stretch of the imagination to think that Judge Kavanaugh may rule on such cases in a vindictive manner that could cause harm to those with whom he feels a personal malice.

I question Judge Kavanaugh's basic judgement and ability to control his mental and emotional impulses as a judge. I certainly did not see a person who possessed such an ability during those hearing.

I am hoping, beyond hope, that my writing to the Complaint of Judicial Misconduct of Disability Department, (an unprecedented act for me, I can assure you) might be but one of many submissions, contributing to a growing chorus of concerned citizens who witnessed, with some degree of shock, the behavior of Judge Kavanaugh.

I am including a list of (ridiculous) perjuries I believe Judge Kavanaugh committed while under oath. I am not a legal expert, nor am I an attorney, but I am a deeply concerned citizen.

I've included my (limited) observations about potential perjuries or misrepresentations of facts and truths during the Kavanaugh hearings:

There is no doubt that Judge Kavanaugh misrepresented the meaning of at least 3 slang references to drinking or sexual acts.

His answers were patently false and, in my opinion, horribly cringe worthy.

(As I write this, I cannot really believe that I am writing this about a hearing involving a nominee for the Supreme Court.)

1)"Ralphng" means vomiting from alcohol consumption. It does not mean one has a "weak stomach" as Judge Kavanaugh stated under oath.

2) "Bouf" or "boufing" means intercourse, anal or otherwise, and does not refer to flatulence, as Kavanaugh stated under oath.

3) The Devil'sTriangle is NOT "a drinking game," as Kavanaugh stated under oath, but refers to 3-way sexual encounters between two men and a woman. It can also refer to 3 types of intercourse with a woman in one night.

4) Judge Kavanaugh states he is "open to any investigation" yet he refused to answer a question during the Senate hearings about whether he would submit to a lie detector test or an FBI investigation.

5) A Democratic Senator stated Judge Kavanaugh made erroneous statements during his Senate hearing, likely concerning his knowledge of stolen emails from Democratic members of the judicial committee. He may have had email communications about this matter, then denied knowledge of these emails, this matter, during the hearing.

6) Judge Kavanaugh likely lied about whether or not he had watched or had knowledge of Dr. Ford's opening statements during her testimony. He stated he had not watched, yet it has been reported that he had.

Senator Blumenthal quoted the legal principle "Falsus in uno, falsus in omnibus" which is a legal principle that dictates jurors can rule a witness to

be false in everything if he says one thing that is not true. I believe if any of the above is correct, one has to conclude that Judge Kavanaugh lied under oath.

He should be reprimanded by the A.B.A. this, along with his gross display of intemperate behavior unbecoming of a judge.
