Ten years of accomplishments on the KCLB

Mayor McGlashan's letter, read on behalf of the City Council, Library Board, and citizens of Shoreline, listed major accomplishments during Judge Eadie's ten years of service on the King County Library Board:

- Voter approval of a \$172 million capital bond measure by a resounding 63.57%;
- Implementation of the new Automated Materials Handling system in 2005;
- Receiving prestigious National Leadership Grant of nearly \$1 million from the Institute of Museum and Library Services;
- KCLS honored as the 2011 Library of the Year by Library Journal and Gale/Cengage Learning; and
- Approval and implementation of KCLS's Future Services Strategy.
