Excellent vigorous motion. The only comments we have on the Motion are stylistic.

- 1. Added collateral source rule to the list of challenges in paragraph 6.
- 2. "More than" is preferable to "over" in the context of numbers because "over" is positional rather than quantitative
- 3. Changed "Appellants" and "Respondents" into Windermere and the DeCourseys. This is in accordance with either the Rules or the Local Rules and a legal style book we read recently.
- 4. The declaration starts in first person, then slips into "the undersigned" (non-person). Tried to fix this with first person plural "we", but ran into further awkardness in paragraphs 7 and 8, so it is maybe not a solution. At that point it could be: I, Lane Powell, the DeCourseys, DeCourseys and their counsel ... gah!
- 5. Carol likes "makes" arguments instead of "includes" in para 6.

Whatever you decide. It could go in just as you have it with the same effect on the judges.
